The water cycle and the weather

Rain comes from the water in the sea. First, the sun shines on the sea. It warms the water. Can you find this?

The water becomes water vapour. This process is called evaporation. The wind carries the water vapour up into the sky. Can you find this?

High in the sky the air is cooler. When the water vapour meets the cooler air, it becomes very small drops of water that form clouds. This process is called condensation.

Can you find this?

The small drops of water join together and become rain drops. The raindrops are bigger and heavier than the clouds and fall to the ground. It's raining! Can you find this?

If it's very cold or high in the mountains, it snows. Can you find this? The rain and snow falls into the rivers and the rivers carry the water back to the sea. And it starts all over again! This is the water cycle.

Four rules for healthy living

Your health is very important! Here are four rules to keep you healthy:

- 1 **Eat healthy food**. It's a good idea to eat five portions of fruit and vegetables every day. Don't eat lots of <u>junk food</u>. If you feel hungry between meals, eat an an apple or a banana.
- 2 Drink lots of water. Your body is 70% water, so it needs lots of water to keep it healthy. You should drink six to eight glasses of water every day. Don't drink lots of sweet drinks because the sugar is bad for your teeth.
- **Get enough sleep**. Your body needs to <u>rest</u> every day. Most adults need seven or eight hours of sleep every night, and children need more. Don't be tired!

There are thousands of different types of plants. Some grow in hot, dry deserts. Can you think of a plant that grows in the desert?

Some plants grow in cold, wet forests. Some grow under the ice and snow! Do you know any plants that grow in cold places?

Plants can make their own food. This process is called photosynthesis. They need air, water and sunlight. The plants take a gas called carbon dioxide from the air and water from the rain.
